#### MINUTES

#### LENOIR COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

#### November 16, 2020

The Lenoir County Board of Commissioners met in open session at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, November 16, 2020, at the North Carolina Cooperative Extension/Lenoir County Center, 1791 NC 11, Kinston, NC.

Members present: Chairman Linda Rouse Sutton, Vice-Chairman Roland Best Commissioners, June Cummings, Mac Daughety, Preston Harris, and Craig Hill.

Members Absent: Commissioner Eric Rouse

Also present were: Michael S. James, County Manager, Joey R. Bryan, Assistant County Manager, Vickie Freeman King, Clerk to the Board, Robert Griffin, County Attorney, and members of the general public and news media.

#### **Call To Order**

Chairman Sutton called the meeting to order at approximately 4:00 p.m.

Mr. Harris offered the Invocation, and Ms. Sutton led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **Public Information**

Resolution Honoring Walter LaRoque, IV. Mr. Harris read the resolution.

Ms. Sutton stated the Board wished to publicly recognize Mr. LaRoque for his dedication and faithfully serving the Regional Aging Advisory Committee for over forty (40) years. Also, for his efforts and service to Lenoir County and its citizens. Mr. Hill presented Mr. LaRoque with the Resolution.

Mr. Steve Hines, Board of Elections Director, shared information and statistics with the Board and viewing audience regarding the recent 2020 general election. The present climate made this year's election very different. He mentioned this year Lenoir County had an 74% voter turnout which was a tremendous amount for our county compared to 2016 which was a 68.5% turnout, out of the registered 38,539 voters,28,525 citizens voted. When you look at the early voter numbers compared to 2016, 1,700 additional individuals voted. Election day voting number was actually down. 4,475 people to show to vote compared to 2018 numbers which were 7,318. People did not wait until election day to cast their votes. Absentee by mail had almost 2,600 people. Overall, the Board of Elections was pleased with their numbers this year. The average is 75%, and the county was at 74%. Lenoir County was 7<sup>th</sup> on election night to get the results in. Mr. Hines attributed the success of BOE on election night to several factors: The Commissioners funding the new voting equipment which is a lot faster, a phone bank system at their office with five people answering calls/questions pertaining to voting which left the office staff open to answer questions from the precincts, 6 early voting sites were available which voted almost 21,000 people, opened all precincts with the social distance protocols in place.

Mr. Samuel Kornegay, EMS Deputy Director, shared information regarding the current projections of the Neuse River and some potential impacts that could be seen in Lenoir County over the upcoming week. The current river level is at 17 ½ feet, with major flood stage being 21 feet. Based on the current projections we should crest at about 21.7 feet by Friday night. Historically at 21 feet Highway 11/55 shuts down between Highway 70 and Goodman Road. Twenty-two feet is when they will look at closing down highway 258 S being between Highway 70 and old Asphalt Road. The potential impacts that can be seen along with those already mentioned low line flooding areas are highway 70 near the river bridges, Crawley Timber, River Marines. Rivers and wetland areas always have the potential to flood. They might see some damage but not sure as to the amount until after it happens. They will continue to work with the state and local agencies to respond accordingly. The river level at the Neuse Way Nature Center has begun to rise. Mr. Kornegay pointed out that this is not a Hurricane Floyd or Matthew event and they do not expect any catastrophic flooding.

Upon a motion by Mr. Daughety and a second by Mr. Best, the consent agenda was unanimously approved for Items 1-11, and Items from the regular agenda.

Chairman Sutton read the NC Ethics Law statement.

#### HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

All purchase orders in the amount of \$2,500 or greater require the approval by the Board of Commissioners. The EMS Division is required to maintain a specific amount of medical supplies in order to sufficiently perform the functions of an EMS provider, with some of those supplies being specialized and require purchase from specific vendors.

#### EVALUATION:

Approval of this resolution will allow and increased encumbrance of funds approved in the FY 20-21 budget and the eventual payment of services as billed. Staff researched and found that the above vendor is our most utilized vendor for the specialized supplies of Glucose Test Strips, Catheter, IV Solution, Syringes, Nasal Tubing and ECG Chart Paper. These items are used for the purpose of essential medical treatment during transport and, at times, exceed \$2,500 in invoice amounts due to the need for these specialized medical supplies. Staff has done cost comparisons and utilizes the vendor with the lowest prices; however, some items are specific and must be purchased by specific vendors.

Due to an aging and Recently wind damaged roof on the Fire Station Museum located at 118S Queen Street, emergency repair is necessary to prevent further water damage to the interior of the building. The rubber roof was recently torn by a high wind event and water is finding its way into the building in several locations. The County has a significant investment in the Fire Station Museum and we are entrusted to maintain the aesthetic and structural integrity of the building. These repairs will ensure this by preventing further water infiltration into the building thus extending the life of the current roofing system. This is not a complete replacement.

#### EPDM Parapet Wall and Roof Repair Detail

- Cut back flashing materials un-adhered or wrinkled until fully-adhered materials are reached. Field membrane in these zones will be mechanically attached, as needed.
- Inspect parapet wall substrates for deterioration.
- Prep, prime, and adhere existing single-ply EPDM wall flashings and affected single-ply EPDM membrane, as needed.



#### HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

The impact of COVID-19 has been felt across every department in Lenoir County. Since March of 2020, all Lenoir County Employees have worked extremely hard to ensure services are provided to the citizens of Lenoir County. During this time, we have established that tele-working does work and that productivity can remain high. While maintaining these services, our employees have been worried about their health, as well as the health of their loved ones. Along with health concerns, many employees are having to deal with childcare issues simultaneously. With this new operational agility comes a different set of risks to employee wellbeing. Employee fatigue and burnout is a great concern in which we wish to address.

#### EVALUATION:

Human Resources request the Board to approve three (3) additional days of vacation for all full-time Lenoir County Employees. Several departments, such as Emergency Services, the Sheriff's Office, and DSS, have had many employees absent due to exposure to COVID-19. The remaining employees have stepped up and taken on additional job responsibilities to keep operations moving for Lenoir County Government. Deep fatigue and extreme stress, combined with other anxieties around COVID-19 and the lack of a clear endpoint, are likely to result in a reduction in employee wellbeing and engagement. Allotting more vacation time gives employees breathing room from the inescapable pressures many are facing during this time. Employee burnout is a real prospect in which we hope to avoid by approval of this Resolution.

These three (3) additional days will be coded as "Lenoir" time in our Munis HR System. This way, supervisors, as well as Department Manager's, will know when the time has been exhausted. The additional days will be available for use starting January 1, 2021, and must be exhausted by December 31, 2021.

#### GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF NOMINEES FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LENOIR MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, INCORPORATED

Lenoir Memorial Hospital, Incorporated, is a very important part of the economy of Lenoir County and the future and success of the Hospital is vital to the continued economic development of the County.

The County of Lenoir has no legal responsibility for the financial operation of the Hospital except for retirement of the Hospital's General. Obligation Bonds. However; the County does have a great moral responsibility for the Hospital's outstanding revenue bonds because default on these bonds would be a negative reflection on the total County and its credit rating.

The Hospital Board of Directors is responsible for the operation of the Hospital and should be allowed to fulfill its responsibilities without undue efforts of control by the Lenoir County Commissioners or any other group.

The Board of Directors of the Hospital is one of the most complex and difficult Boards to serve on in the County. A rapidly changing health care environment, declining reimbursement, the increasing frustration of health care professionals, competition from within and without; and new ethical issues are but some of the myriad complex issues with which a Hospital Board Member must deal.

The community entrusts the Board of Directors with safeguarding the assets of the Hospital, furthering the goals of providing good health care to its citizens, and perpetuating Lenoir Memorial Hospital as a not-for-profit community Hospital. Because of these responsibilities, it is incumbent upon the Hospital Board of Directors to select and the Lenoir County Board of Commissioners to appoint the best and most qualified citizens of Lenoir County as members of the Board of Directors of the Hospital to carry out the Hospital's mission:

A Director should possess the qualities of honesty and integrity, and be of good moral and ethical character.

A Director should exhibit strong leadership skills.

A Director should possess the ability to conceptualize and objectively view the entire Hospital operation from a broad perspective. He should have the ability to grasp complex health care issues, and work into spirit of cooperation with other Board members.

A Director should demonstrate a willingness to devote the time necessary to become educated into the complexities of Hospital operations and participate actively in Board functions as assigned:

A Director should exhibit a strong commitment to the community and to the provision of good health care.

The Board's composition should represent a mix of competencies, including competency in health care, medicine, management, education, law, and finance.

All other factors considered, appointments should result in a balanced representation of the community served.

#### MAJOR POINTS OF SELECTION

The hospital Board of Directors will continue to nominate candidates for each position to be filled and Commissioners will appoint from the nominations to fill each position.

- The Board of Commissioners of Lenoir County should be required to appoint within a specified time frame (30 days) after nominations are received from the Hospital Board.
- 3. The Hospital Directors intend to have two physicians on the Board to benefit from their expertise.
- Individual Directors will remain on the Board until their successors are appointed and seated.
- 5. Appointments to the Hospital Board must not be for the purpose of satisfying the wishes of individual Board members, administrators, or any special interest groups. All appointments shall be made with the overall best interest of the Hospital in mind.
